

## **BAYLOR UNIVERSITY'S MBA HEALTHCARE PROGRAM EARNS SEAL OF APPROVAL FROM CAHME**

The Robbins MBA Healthcare Program at Baylor University's Hankamer School of Business achieved accreditation from the Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Management Education (CAHME). CAHME serves universities and programs in a voluntary peer review process as a means to continuously improve graduate education. In doing so, CAHME accreditation becomes the benchmark by which students and employers determine the integrity of healthcare management education and establishes the standard of measurement for the world community.

## **BAYLOR ACCOUNTING STUDENTS RANK NATIONALLY FOR CPA EXAM PASS RATES**

Baylor Accounting students continue an established tradition by performing among the best on the 2009 Uniform Certified Public Accounting (CPA) exam. Among all graduate students taking all four parts of the CPA exam for the first time, Baylor's master of Accountancy (MAcc) and Taxation (MTax) students ranked No. 3 in the nation with a pass rate of 87.5 percent. This is the fourth time in the past five years that Baylor students have posted a top-five national pass rate.

## **HANKAMER STUDENTS PLACE IN COMPETITIONS**

Two Baylor University student teams competed and won in the 2010 LINKS Global Supply Chain Management Competition held online in October and November. The Baylor teams competed against 36 other teams consisting of 151 participants from universities across the globe during the eight-round online simulation competition. Baylor University students Trent Commons and Joel Huynh placed in the finals of the 2010 Fall Foundation Business Simulation Challenge, an international business simulation competition that attracted almost 300 competitors.
