  - (NS11 chapter 4 (pp. 136-140)): 4.1, 4.3, 4.10, 4.14
  - Read Robert Jensen and Nolan H. Miller's 2008 *American Economic Review* article "Giffen Behavior and Subsistence Consumption" and answer the following questions:
    - What importance do the authors claim from distinguishing between "Giffen goods" and "Giffen behavior"?
    - Describe the authors' theory of the circumstances in which "Giffen behavior" is likely to occur. Include an explanation of Figure 1 in your answer.
    - Describe the empirical methodology the authors use to answer their research questions in detail. Where did it take place, how was it implemented, how are prices exogenously varied and why do they claim that an experiment is preferable to some alternative methodology?
    - Summarize their evidence and what you learned from the study regarding consumer theory, "Giffen behavior" and poverty.
